

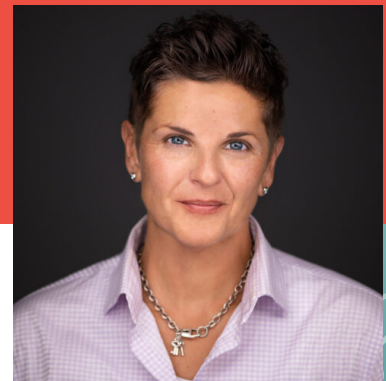
TRUST IN TREATMENT: PEER PERSPECTIVES ON MENTALIZATION IN SUPPORT RELATIONSHIPS
